



<u>Samuthra</u> flows straight from the inner deep dark secrets of women who have dared to move from the East to West but with their lives still revolving around an incomprehensible third space. This movement piece interweaves monologues that will shock and tantalise you and taunt your visual appetite with various Asian theatrical dance/art forms such as Japanese *Bhutto* and Indian *Bharatha* Natiya dance tableau tapered with Indonesian Wayang Kulit. True dark secrets have been adapted for stage and will be shared to the privileged few. Both performance will challenge, shock, shake and move your senses with issues that are sensitive, intimate and repelling.

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

Romz & Julz was an abridged and transcreated work inspired from William Shakespeare's Romeo & Juliet. This play was presented as a concept theatrical piece in Tamil. The story explores the struggle between the love of one Capulet and a Montague.

Romz & Julz was a unique drama styled in a way that allowed the audience the total access to the entire theatrical process both on and off stage. The drama had its conceptual roots in Total Theatre. Total Theatre presents the audience with option to watch the performance on stage or the process of the performance through real time video streams of the dressing room, foyer, wings and scenic runway. The audience can choose to attach themselves to either the Narrative or Process of the play.

He is respected as one of the Gurus not just during his period but also in his actions, then which reflects the truth in our lifestyles today ones that reflect a righteous living. When observing the play closely, we go through his steps and path that he crafted for himself and we question, why then did he fall? A thought provoking play bridging the past and present styles of thinking.

Bhishma is a duologue that was presented in English and Tamil by the same actor with a fifteen minute interval between each performance in Singapore in 2011.



In this drama, the audience witnessed the magic of stage illusion through the live multimedia showcase of the dice game which Sakuni challenges Draupadi to. This drama focused on providing a more balanced interpretation of Sakuni's character based on the incidents in Mahabharatha. Sakuni was premiered in English and Tamil in Singapore in 2012 and also in different districts in South India as well.
















Adagu

Same essence, different elements: the state of Tamil theatre in Singapore


This presentation explores the state of Tamil Theatre in Singapore, with particular emphasis placed on issues of cultural and linguistic identity of the Singapore Tamils and the politics of performance-making in Singapore. The tension these factors create affects the artistic expression of this minority group, leading to a state of ambiguity yet creating a Singapore brand of Tamil Theatre.

Selvananthan Ganesan is an accomplished local theatre director. To date he has written, directed and acted in more than 50 plays in English and Tamil, including overseas productions. Selva started off as an actor in the 1980s and soon progressed to writing and directing his own plays. He has acted and directed numerous Tamil and English theatre productions.

Selva graduated with a Bachelor of Arts (Hons) Degree in Media Arts and Drama from Deakin University, Melbourne in 2005.












Antham Aathi


Singapore Tamil Youth Conference 2018: Conference Panel Discussion on Arts







Nammavar For SingLit Festival


On the Street of Calcutta




Yaen? Live Performance Presented Online

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Planned as a large scale production with period style costumes and sets Venice Vanigan was made to be transpose a minimalist presentation because of Covid restrictions. Avant Theatre was later invited to be part of Ministry of Community Culture and Youth (MCCY) and National Arts Concil's (NAC) PILOT projects in slowly inviting the audience into theatre space to watch "LIVE" performance in Phase 2. Avant Theatre restructed this trancreation work rom Shakespears, The Merchant of Venice from a 2 hour production to 1 hr 20 mins abridged and abstract version and presented to 50 audience pershow for four remarkable shows. Two version of costume was explored, mainly the Traditional Indian and Modern Western style that awed the audience to encourge this effort. This signals the honour to still entertain the audience even during difficuly times.


